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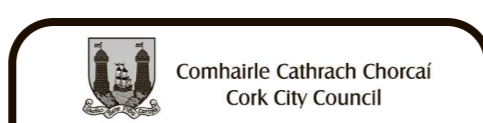

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY INTERVENTIONS – ST. PATRICK'S ROAD NOTICE UNDER SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Cork City Council hereby gives notice of its intention to carry out the following traffic management measures in the interest of the safety and convenience of road users.

St. Patrick's Road
It is proposed to install a controlled pedestrian crossing on St. Patrick's Road. The controlled crossing is to be installed adjacent to the junction of Congress Road and Deerpark Mews. New road markings and signage as well as ancillary works will also be carried out in the area.

The main elements of the proposed works in this location are:

- Provision of a controlled pedestrian crossing on St. Patrick's Road
- Upgraded junction layout at the intersection of St. Patrick's Road, Congress Road and Murphy's Gardens
- Installation of raised table uncontrolled crossing at junction with Deerpark Mews
- Footpath installation at St. Patrick's Road, Congress Road, Murphy's Gardens and Deerpark Mews
- New road marking and signage
- Drainage works
- Resurfacing works
- Other necessary associated works

PART 8 PLANNING NOTICE UNDER SECTION 179 OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 2000 AND PART 8 OF THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2001 (AS AMENDED)

Pursuant to the requirements of Part 8 of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001 (as amended), notice is hereby given that Cork City Council plans to carry out the South Douglas Road Junction Upgrade

The proposed development consists of:

- Replacement of the existing roundabout at the Junction of the South Douglas Road (R851), the N40 West Douglas off ramp and Willow Park, with a new traffic signalised T-junction
- Improved pedestrian facilities with extension of footpaths and provision of pedestrian crossings
- Provision of new raised off road cycle tracks on South Douglas Road (R851), N40 West Douglas off ramp and Willow Park
- Relocation of the bus stop on the northern side of the South Douglas Road
- Coordination of proposed traffic signals with existing traffic signals at the West Douglas/N40 On Ramp junction
- Revised layout of road into and out of Willow Park and Gaelscoil na Duiglaise
- Revised layout of traffic lanes on the N40 West Douglas off ramp.

In accordance with the Habitats Directive, an **Appropriate Assessment Screening** has been carried out on the project, in relation to any potential impacts upon the Cork Harbour Special Protection Area [Site No. 004030] and the Great Island Channel Special Area of Conservation [Site No. 001058]. The findings of the AA screening noted that no significant effects on any Natura 2000 sites is likely and it was not necessary to undertake any further stage of the Appropriate Assessment process.

In addition, the proposed development has been screened to determine whether an **Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA)** is required and it has been concluded that there will be no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and an EIA is not required.

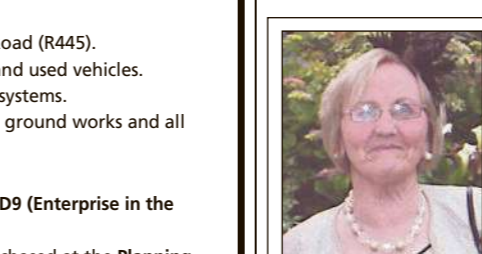
