

## PUBLIC NOTICE CORK UNIVERSITY

HOSPITAL BUS TERMINUS

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 38 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT 1994

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Cork City Council hereby gives notice of its intention to carry out the following traffic management measures in the interest of the safety and convenience of road users.

## Cork University Hospital Bus Terminus

As part of the rollout of the new improved bus network for Cork, new terminal capacity including lay-over space is needed near the Cork University Hospital. The new network has new orbital and radial services commencing on this site (Routes, 5, 10, 14,) and enhanced services on new routes 2, 15 and 30. New accessible bus stops/stands on Bishopstown Road, outside Cork University Hospital are required to support the proposed increase in services at this location.

The main elements of the proposed works are:

- Widen the existing bus slip lane past Wilton Roundabout, and provide bus stop/stands, with capacity for three buses.
- Removal of one tree to accommodate bus lane widening and replacement with two trees.

  Pengwal/replacement of other read drainage read.
- Renewal/replacement of other road drainage, road signage and road markings as might be necessary.
   All other associated ancillary site works.

In accordance with the Habitats Directive, an Appropriate Assessment (AA) Screening has been carried out for the project, in relation to any potential impacts upon the Cork Harbour Special Protection Area [Site No. 004030] and the Great Island Channel Special Area of Conservation [Site No. 001058]. The findings of the AA screening concluded that no significant effects on any Natura 2000 sites are likely and it was not necessary to undertake any further stage of the Appropriate Assessment process.

In addition, the proposed project has been screened to determine whether an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) is required and it has been concluded that the proposed development would not be likely to have a significant effect on the environment and that the preparation and submission of an environmental impact report is not therefore required.

All comments, including names and addresses of those making submissions and observations, submitted to Cork City Council in regard to this proposal, will form part of the statutorily required report to be presented at the monthly meeting of Cork City Council. Accordingly, they will be included in the minutes of that meeting and may appear in the public domain. Cork City Council will retain data for no longer than is necessary and in accordance with the Council's Retention Policy and relevant Data Protection legislation.
