

UPPER GLANMIRE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY SCHEME

Notice under Section 38 of Road Traffic Act 1994

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994, Cork City Council hereby gives notice of its intention to carry out traffic calming works along the R616, Upper Glanmire Road, White Cross, Ballinvriskig, Co. Cork.

Cork City Council proposes to carry out various measures to improve pedestrian infrastructure along a c. 1.26km section of the R616 (Upper Glanmire Road).

The proposed works will comprise of the following:

- New 2m wide (minimum width 1.8m) concrete footpath, measuring a length of approximately 490m;
- Upgrading of existing concrete footpath to provide width of 2m, measuring a length of approximately 820m;
- 3. Controlled signalised pedestrian crossing;
- 4. Uncontrolled pedestrian crossing;
- Provision of raised and ramped table at intersecting junction with L2974 and reduction in junction radii to 6m;
- 6. New public lighting columns;
- Provision of new signage, utility services such as drains, ducting and other associated work.

Drawings and particulars of the proposal are available for inspection at Cork City Council, City Hall, Co. Cork and may be inspected during normal office hours from 30th March to 27th April 2022 inclusive.
